



Principles organising movement




8 principles defined by Canadien researchers after analysing experienced manual handlers




• Execute transfers safely and comfortably for the client and the carer






• Facilitate the client's independence in their daily activities






• Appropriate use of aids and equipment


Choice of tasks and scenarios

• Two types of clients: actors and real clients












Choice of transfer technique and equipment

Filming process



Some transfers are complex






